Department of Public Works: Igor Sikiric, Superintendent**Sanitation February 2026 :**

- 308 tons of refuse and recycling consisting of:
 - 278 tons of MSW
 - 15 tons of newspaper
 - 15 tons of commingled recyclables
- There are no double days between now and our next board meeting
- Bulk waste and E-waste pickups can only be scheduled by calling Village Hall
 - Bulk waste is collected every Monday and Friday; and E-waste is collected on Wednesdays
- Curbside Yard Waste collection will begin the first Wednesday in April and will continue through November
 - Curbside yard waste collection is only for homeowner debris
 - Material and debris collected by landscapers may not be placed at the curb for collection
- Cardboard must be flattened and bundled
 - No full boxes or boxes with garbage or Styrofoam inside will be collected
 - Do not put your cardboard out for collection with your bottles and cans, it will not be collected
 - All recyclables must be properly secured with a lid on the pail or placed in a plastic bag

Operations:

- Installation and repair of new street signs and poles due to aging and damage is on-going
 - In February, approximately 25 street signs were installed, repaired or replaced
- DPW staff performed weekly maintenance and cleanup operations along Jericho Tpke, LIRR corridor, and parking lots
- Litter pick-up along sidewalks, median areas, and parking lots is conducted on a weekly basis
- All vegetation maintenance is now being conducted on an as needed basis
- Street sweeping operations will be conducted daily starting in the Spring

Routine Tree Maintenance:

- Routine tree maintenance requests and tree preventative maintenance procedures are on-going and will continue as needed
 - DPW conducted 3 tree trims and 1 tree removal in February
- The Village's tree maintenance contractor will be back in the Village in the late Spring/early Summer to conduct tree trims and removals
 - If you have any questions or concerns regarding the tree in front of your house or would like to request a new tree, please use the MyVNHP App or call the Village Hall
 - We are currently taking tree planting requests for the Fall
- In February, DPW received and staff responded to approximately 25 service requests that were received via the MyVNHP App or phone calls to Village Hall
 - The majority of calls this month were regarding snow
- Pothole repairs were conducted several times in February and approximately 25 potholes and road repairs were conducted
- DPW will be out performing pothole repairs on an as needed basis
 - Any larger or more invasive repairs will be conducted in the Spring and Summer

- There was 1 very large snow event on February 22nd and February 23rd
 - DPW staff pre-treated roads with salt, plowed, and salted again after the event
 - This snow event was one of the biggest storms to hit our area in over 20 years with approximately 20-22 inches of snow falling over a 20-hour period
 - DPW was out salting and plowing for approximately 18 hours straight
- The catch basin on the corner of Bryant Ave and N 5th Street was repaired
 - The interior walls of the basin had crumbled causing the basin to sink and have been replaced
 - The top slab has been repaired as well

DPW Renovation Update:

- The DPW renovation project is mostly complete
 - Waiting for the contractor to complete several punch list items

S 12th Street Parking Lots and Park:

- The new park construction at S 12th Street is also mostly complete
 - The only remaining items left to complete are the bathrooms and police booth

Building Department: Binu Pillay, Superintendent:

ZBA

- The last scheduled meeting of the Zoning Board and Appeals was scheduled for March 11th with 3 applications submitted: 2 for a dormer and a new portico; and 1 for a change of name on an SEP; which were approved
- The next meeting is scheduled for April 8th with no applications submitted

ARB

- The last meeting of the Architectural Review Board was scheduled for February 25th with 2 applications submitted: 1 for a commercial sign; and 1 for a cellar entrance, which were approved
- The next meeting is scheduled for March 25th with 5 applications submitted: 4 for dormers and 1 for windows color change

VILLAGE COURT

- The last Village Court was held on March 18th with 35 cases which comprised of: 1- Garbage out on a holiday; 19- Property maintenance and sidewalk not clean; 2- Exiting without a legal apron, boxes blocking the street; 3-Building in disrepair; 4- Car illegally parked; 4- Violation of agreement; and 2- Construction without a permit
- The next village court will be held on April 15, 2026 with 25 cases which comprise of: 1- Running a business out of a home; 7- Property maintenance; 6- Working w/o a permit; 1- Health hazards conditions; 5- Single family use by more than 1 family; and 4- Violation of agreement

RENTAL REGISTRATION

- Rental registration is in process and inspections are being conducted accordingly

SPECIAL USE

- There was no special use cases heard in February, and there is no special use application to be heard tonight
- During the period from February 19th to March 19th, the Building Department issued 26 permits: 9- Building permits; 6- Plumbing permits; 4- Sidewalk/driveway; 1- Roof; 2- Signs; 2- Dumpster; and 2 HVAC
- There were also 6- Certificates of Approval; 28- Certificates of Completion; and 6- Rental Registration Certificates

LIRR Track Work

- Two major projects are forecasted this year with the LIRR the Queens Interlocking Project and the Floral Park/Bellerose Station reconstruction
 - The Queens Interlocking Project is a project designed to modernize and streamline the track, signal and other infrastructure between Floral Park and Queens Village Stations

- The Floral Park/Bellerose Station reconstruction projects are essentially the same thing that happened at New Hyde Park; we are rebuilding both stations and in the case of Bellerose, bringing it into compliance with current ADA statute
- Neither one of these should have any direct construction impact or service impact on New Hyde Park
- The Queens Interlocking project in fact has already started
- LIRR will keep us posted on any maintenance project within our area

Water Authority

- Station 40 HQ – Project is wrapping up
 - Walk through scheduled for March 26th for the Department of Health
 - Electrical work still needs to be completed and they are pushing hard to meet the March 26th date
- Station 44 Elmont – Project on hold
 - The Water Authority is awaiting acknowledgement and a plan from the surety company of the general contractor who abandoned the project
- Station 28 Treatment Building (Elmont)
 - Design plans have been submitted to DOH and we are awaiting their response

Clerk's Office:

- Thank you, Rebecca, for sharing our monthly Financial Report
- The Clerk's Office will be doing a Tax Lien sale on Wednesday, April 1st at 2pm
- The Tentative Budget for the year 2026-2027 has been prepared and is available for public view as of 2pm on March 19th
 - A copy can be found on the Village website and on request in the Clerk's Office
 - The Tax cap for our residents is 1.99% which is an increase of approximately \$35 to \$37 per household

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG):

- There have been some changes that may impact our Grants
- We have heard back for the 51st year and were awarded funds
 - As a reminder to our residents, we use our money and then submit reimbursements
- The Office also applied for the year 52nd year and we are supposed to hear from them by September

Residential Rehab:

- We had one Resident come forward and apply for funds
 - The Village is hoping that this Resident qualifies to take advantage of the program

JCAP Grant:

- I am happy to announce that we have received funds from JCAP grant in the amount of \$14,999.85 on March, 2, 2026
 - We have 180 days to complete the use of these funds
 - The monies are supposed to be used for what it was approved for. for example, shredding court records and purchasing equipment for court

Mayor Christopher Devane:

Mayor Devane began his report commenting on the St. Patrick's Day Parade mentioning that it was a great event and great way to honor all First Responders. Everyone had a fantastic time at the event.

- The 2026-2027 Budget is now out
 - There is somewhat of an increase
 - The Village is proud that it came in under the 2% Tax Cap even though we are finishing up the refurbishment of DPW, opening Sakowich Park on the Southside, finalizing Village Hall and building a new Community Center
- In addition to our Auditor last month stating that the Fiscal condition of the Village is "Excellent", the State Controller did an evaluation of our "Fiscal Stress", which is done on all Local Municipalities
 - They came in, looked at our books and gave our Fiscal stress a score of score of 3.3, which is good
 - It is 21.7 points lower than the score of 25, which indicates that there is an issue
 - The Village has come in at 3.3 for the fiscal years 2023, 2024 and 2025
 - This is a major accomplishment that we will take credit for, especially with all the projects in the Village: refurbished the entire Village Hall; Memorial Park, the Community Center and DPW Project and a new park opening on the Southside
 - He thanked the Department Heads for all that they do
 - We are proud to spend your money wisely

There is a lot of progress being made throughout the Village

- Sakowich Park may be pushed back to the end of May
 - We will have a grand Opening celebration to open it
 - The Southend will certainly appreciate since they were the ones who bore the brunt of the construction
- Nuzzi Park - We submitted a Federal Grant application to do work on it
- Community Center opens in July
- Potholes are being addressed throughout the village
- Putting meters in on Jericho Tpke that will use the Kiosk or the Flowbird app, removing the traditional meters
 - These meters are cashless and will be installed late spring
 - Will still have some meters on the side-streets
- We expect the Community Center to open in July
 - We want the Community Groups that request to use the Community Center to participate in the Village Events
 - If your Group wants to use our facility you should participate in the local community events
 - We need to work together as a community

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 PM and a motion was made by Deputy Mayor Nijjar, seconded by Tr. Burger, and unanimously approved, to go back into an Executive Session. The Executive Session ended at 8:30 PM.
